

#### FROM THE MATHEMATICS FACULTY

Year 9 students have enjoyed studying the topic Trigonometry in Mathematics this semester. Trigonometry is a branch of mathematics concerned with relationships between angles and lengths. Students were able to apply their skills and knowledge learnt in class and work collaboratively as a team. Students completed a practical investigation to measure the height of trees in the playground. They used a clinometer, an instrument to measure the angle to the top of the tree. They also took into consideration their own height when performing calculations. Students recorded their data and used diagrams and calculations to determine the height of various trees and calculated the average for a more accurate measurement. This practical activity promoted students' collaborative, investigative skills, higher order thinking and creativity. Students valued seeing the significance of the real-life application of the content studied in mathematics.







Over the course of this academic year, many of our students have spent a total of 180 hours engaged in the fascinating world of Mathematics. This is not just a number; it represents the countless moments of curiosity, problem-solving, and intellectual growth that have unfolded in our classrooms.

We wish to take this opportunity to shine a spotlight on some exceptional students who have not only embraced the challenges of Mathematics, but have excelled in it. We are proud to congratulate the following young ladies for their outstanding commitment and achievement in this subject:

Let us remember that success in Mathematics is not limited to a select few. Each student's journey in this subject is unique, and every effort deserves recognition. Whether you've mastered complex equations or are still working on your mathematical skills, your commitment to learning is commendable, and we applaud you all.

Once again, congratulations to our outstanding students, and let us all continue to celebrate the beauty of Mathematics in our lives.

<u>Intensive Learning Support Program (ISLP):</u> Year 8 students are working with Mr Millhouse in five small groups of five students to receive intensive learning support with numeracy. Each group meets with Mr Millhouse three times each week for a minimum of five weeks.

The small group tuition allows each student more opportunity to ask questions and to get immediate feedback on their work. Each student is provided with an ILSP booklet to work with that contains carefully selected resources that focus on the skills and objectives that are being targeted.

The first round of five groups took place in Term 2 and the learning support focused on fractions, decimals and percentages. In Term 3 the focus was on numeracy that supports the processes in algebraic calculations.

Ms Sud started working in Term 3 with a group of Year 9 students in ILSP Numeracy, with particular focus on enhancing financial numeracy in topic areas such as wages and salaries.

Ms loannidis worked in Term 3 with a group of Year 7 students in ILSP Literacy, with particular focus on improving their use of punctuation, as well as their ability to comprehend and infer meaning from texts.

ILSP groups are collected by each teacher after approximately 20 minutes of a lesson to allow their classroom teacher some time to introduce the lesson intentions to the whole class. Withdrawal from subjects is shared fairly across the Key Learning Areas of the curriculum so as not to affect any student in any subject area.




#### FROM THE PDHPE FACULTY
